Dear Parent/Guardian

As we approach the end of our 2nd week of remote learning, I would like to take this opportunity to thank both you and your children for the continued enthusiasm that has been clearly evident in your approach to the tasks set by teachers on both SeeSaw and Google Classroom. We know it isn't easy but rest assured, you are all doing a great job.

As expected we have seen an increasing demand for places for supervised learning and as a school, we are delighted to be able to offer this vital support for our parents who are key workers. However with the increasing number of children coming into school, we will have to make slight adjustments as to how we support these children in school.

From the beginning of next week, all learning packs should come into school on the day that your child/children has registered and should be taken home on that day also. If they are coming in every day, the pack should go home at the end of each day and parents are responsible to make sure the pack comes in the next day. The reason for this is, with increased numbers, staff will not be responsible for submitting work on SeeSaw or Google Classroom. The exception to this will be when a P1 or P2 child completes a practical activity that needs to be photographed and submitted after completion.

Also when children are in school, the morning session until 12pm will be set aside for the completion of tasks set by teachers and after lunch the children will engage in other activities eg art activity or movie afternoon. Any work not completed in the morning session will be sent home within packs to be completed at home.

For all parents, due to the increased numbers that staff are being expected to supervise in school please allow 24 hours for teachers to reply to messages and allow for 48 hours for work to be assessed once uploaded to either SeeSaw or Google Classroom.

Finally, if work is being completed and submitted independently by children, especially in Key Stage 2, please ensure it has been checked by an adult and signed. We are finding an increasing number of children are not reading instructions carefully, meaning tasks are not completed correctly.
